
NOTICE TO ALL, starting in January 2020, In a common effort to save paper, time and money, we would like to reduce the number of paper copies of the Info Métis.



The Carrousel offers a movie and creative activity for 3 years and older. During the 50 minutes activity, we will watch an animated short film and make our own thaumatrope.



Louise Penny, Inspector Gamache series (adult novel)

Recommended by Carol Hague

Chief Inspector Armand Gamache of Sûreté du Québec is the main character in a series of mystery novels written by Canadian author Louise Penny. The stories generally take place in Three Pines, the fictional location set in the Eastern Townships of Québec. Each book features a murder but the books contain little or no sex or violence. Instead, Penny explores the relationships between the characters. The books are meant to be read in order but each one contains enough background information to be read as a stand-alone. If you like Sherlock Holmes and Father Brown, you will love Armand Gamache. The first book, Still Life, is available from the library.



Diana Souhami, The trials of Radcliffe Hall (adult non-fiction)

Radclyffe Hall was born in 1880 in Bournemouth in a house inappropriately named 'Sunny Lawn'. At the mercy of a violent mother and abusive stepfather, her life changed when at the age of eighteen she inherited her father's estate. She was free to travel, pursue women and write - most notably The Well of Loneliness, her famous novel about 'congenital inverts', which was declared 'inherently obscene' by the Home Secretary and banned. In this brilliantly written, witty and satirical biography Diana Souhami brings a fresh and irreverent eye to the life of this intriguing and troubled woman.



Bill Bryson At H@me A Short History of Private Lafe A Short Histo

Bill Bryson, At Home (adult non-fiction)

Bill Bryson and his family live in a Victorian parsonage in a part of England where nothing of any great significance has happened since the Romans decamped. Yet one day, he began to consider how very little he knew about the ordinary things of life as found in that comfortable home. To remedy this, he formed the idea of journeying about his house from room to room to "write a history of the world without leaving home." Whatever happens in the world, he demonstrates, ends up in our house, in the paint and the pipes and the pillows and every item of furniture.

Tony Abbott, The Hidden Stairs and the Magic Carpet (youth novel)

Eric, Julie, and Neal have just found something magic in Eric's basement. They have discovered a staircase to another world! The world of Droon is amazing - full of magic, flying lizards, and fun, furry creatures. But how will Eric, Julie, and Neal find their way home?





Tribute to Miss Kathy Dodson for her 35 years of teaching career and community engagement

On Tuesday, November 19, at the Assemblée nationale, the deputy of Matane-Matapédia-Mitis, Pascal Bérubé, gave a tribute to Miss Kathy Dodson.

Declaration extract as given from Pascal Bérubé at the National Assembly at Quebec city:

« Mme la Présidente, aujourd'hui, je souhaite rendre hommage à une dame entièrement dévouée à sa profession et au bien-être de sa collectivité qui nous a malheureusement quittés le 5 octobre dernier. Originaire de la Nouvelle-Écosse, Mme Kathy Dodson fut enseignante pendant 35 ans à Metis Beach School, l'école anglophone de la ville de Métis-sur-Mer. Enseignante attentionnée et passionnée, elle marqua la vie de centaines d'élèves. Mme Dodson ne comptait plus ses heures passées en classe, et son implication allait bien au-delà de son mandat de pédagogue. Toujours attentive et disponible pour ses élèves, elle fut, pour plusieurs, une seconde mère.

Citoyenne impliquée, elle était à la tête de l'organisation de nombreux événements communautaires. Dévouement, engagement, générosité et bienveillance, voilà ce qui marqua la carrière et la vie de Mme Kathy Dodson. Aux membres de la famille, aux amis et à toute la communauté de Métis-sur-Mer, je tiens à offrir mes plus sincères condoléances. My most sincere condolences to her family and friends. Thank you, Ms. Dodson, you will be greatly missed. Merci, Mme la Présidente. »



Info-prévention

THIS HOLIDAY SEASON, BE FIRE SMART!



Christmas Tree Safety.

Choose a freshly cut tree. Needles should be green and hard to pull from branches. Cut the trunk (bevelled) as soon as you arrive at home. The new cut will help your tree better absorb water. Place the tree in a stand with water and add some water every day.

Whether natural or artificial, place the tree more than one meter away from any heat source (radiator, electric heater, fireplace, etc.). Place it out of the way of foot traffic and exits.

At night, lights off!

Turn off all lights as soon as you leave the house or go to bed. Your light decorations and extension cords should be CSA or ULC certified. Prefer low heat emission bulbs (ex.: LED).

Discard light decorations that are defective, dried or cracked and always respect the type of use for which your light decorations and extension cords are designed (indoor or outdoor use).

Do not hide your extension cords under rugs nor let them run through a door entrance. Do not connect extension cords end to end! Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords: use a power bar instead.

Inside and outside: clear the way!

In case of fire, it is essential to be able to quickly evacuate your home. For the safety of your family and your guests, clear up all your exits and balconies after each snowfall. Make sure the escape routes are clear of boots and coats. Make sure windows are cleared and de-iced. A window that is frozen shut could prevent you from getting out.

Identify a meeting point accessible in winter and visible for firefighters upon their arrival.

No candles unattended.

Want to add candles for a more festive ambiance? Be sure to place them on a stable surface and away from any material that could catch on fire. Always keep them out of the reach of children and animals.

Never refill a hot burner!

A good fondue in the holiday season is comforting! Choose an electric fondue pot: it's safer. If you're using a burner stove, be sure to place it on a stable surface that will withstand the heat. Have a second fondue pot to avoid refilling it while it's hot.

Ethanol fireplace: a decoration to use with caution.

Ethanol fireplaces are becoming more and more popular. But these devices are decorative and should not be used to heat a room. Make sure your home is equipped with a carbon monoxide (CO) detector and a suitable portable extinguisher that is in good condition.

Every year at Christmas time, apart from gifts and cakes, you pay to dispose of tons of recyclable, reusable and recoverable waste in the landfill!

So many materials that, once buried, will have long-term impacts on the environment, for you and for future generations. This year, be eco-friendly in your holiday season.

Here are some tips:

A green Christmas tree:

Choose reusable decorations to over single use. It will cost you less in the long run. Use LED bulbs, which are more energy efficient and more durable.

Use washable dishes. Doing the dishes with your family is a fun activity and it's much faster. Try it! **Manage meals** to make sure that the leftovers will be consumed.

Remember, table waste goes into the brown bin, even in the holiday season. Don't forget, compostable plastic bags are now accepted!
