





THE BATTLE OF THE ST. LAWRENCE – FEAR AND LOATHING OF GERMAN U-BOATS

The declaration of war on Germany by Canada on September 10, 1939 brought an end to the peaceable kingdom. Canada joined the war against Hitler's Germany with resolution, but with a modest army and barely any equipment. By war's end, Canada had the third largest air force and fourth largest navy in the world.

Many local men joined the war effort. Several, like Jack Price, Peter MacDougall, C. Douglas Johnston and (future lighthouse keeper) Martial Ouellet were among the first to see action in December, 1941 when the Royal Rifles of Quebec City took part in the defence of Hong Kong against the invasion of Japanese forces. After the garrison fell, their incarceration was to be the longest and most painful endured by Canadians during the Second World War. Many other Metisians joined the armed forces, serving overseas and at home.

The St. Lawrence became a theatre of war in May, 1942 when the SS Nicoya was torpedoed by a German U-

Boat off Saint-Yvon in the Gaspé Peninsula. This was the first salvo in what would be the Battle of the St. Lawrence. Tragedy struck in Metis when the SS *Carolus* was sunk off the Pointe-aux-Senelles by U-69 on October 9, with the loss of 11 crew. The sunken ship today lies just 245 metres off of the Maurice-Lamontagne Institute.

The No. 9 Bombing and Gunnery School was built in Mont-Joli to train airmen for the European theatre. The air base was also home to the RCAF Eastern Air Command, the group of aviators who surveilled the St. Lawrence and helped protect the merchant

marine and naval convoys from the feared U-boats.

The sinking made headlines across the country...but not for a week until Minister of National Defence for Naval Services, Angus L. Macdonald, made the announcement to a stunned House of Commons on October 15. The report contained the beginnings of the story, repeated many times since, however improbable, that a German U-boat had surfaced in the bay while youth danced on the seashore.





This is how the news was reported in the Montreal Gazette on Friday, October 16:

SHIP IN CONVOY SUNK AT METIS **Torpedoed About Week Ago Westbound Off Summer Resort** 12 OF CREW ARE KILLED

18 Landed by Rescue Ships: Ottawa Makes Announcement

Metis Beach, October 15 - An enemy U-boat sent a United Nations freighter to the bottom of the St. Lawrence off this South Shore summer resort a week ago tonight - farther up the river than any previous submarine attack.

Twelve members of the ship's crew lost their lives but 18 others were rescued and landed at an eastern Canadian port. Some of them expressed belief the submarine was sunk by Canadian naval craft escorting the small convoy of which the freighter was a unit. Of this, there was no official confirmation.

The sinking was officially announced today in a statement from Navy Minister Macdonald at Ottawa. Publication of accounts of the incident had been held up for security reasons.

Residents of South Shore communities adjacent to Metis Beach were awakened by the blast of the torpedo,

which was fired just after midnight and which sank the 4,000-ton westbound freighter in a few minutes.

The subsequent hunt for the submarine, during which Canadian corvettes fired star-shells and dropped depth charges, led Octave Gendron to think his lighthouse home was under bombardment and to fear for the safety of his large family.



Gendron keeps the lighthouse which stands on a point jutting out into the river, separated by a wide bay from this summer resort which is popular with holidaymakers from Quebec, Montreal and the United States.

It was not the first contact Gendron had with war. Last July, he told newspapermen, he saw a submarine come to the surface in the bay between his light and the main shore about nine o'clock in the evening. It remained there for about an hour while a dance was in progress at the beach.

This is believed to have been an incident reported from Germany, when a submarine commander claimed he and his crew listened to dance music in Canada and watched the lights of cars travelling along a highway. The scenic Gaspe highway skirts this coast.

COAST LIGHT TURNED OFF

When the torpedo blast occurred Thursday night Gendron reported the incident to the nearby Royal Canadian Air Force training station and obtained permission to turn off his light. He thought the enemy was bent on smashing the lighthouse. He loaded his whole household – Mme. Gendron, eight children and Esther Leblanc, the local school teacher who boards with them – into his car to get them out of range. The other five Gendron children were away from home, some attending college and some working.

On the July appearance of the submarine he reported the incident to the authorities and some officers came to question him about it. Later he wrote a letter to Defence Minister Macdonald.

Mr. Macdonald's statement today did not mention the possibility that the submarine was sunk. It said simply that the submarine was not seen.





OF MUNICIPAL TAXES

As stipulated in the Cities and Towns Act, section VI, article 511, after the expiration of the six month period following the date of the notice of the deposit of the collection role, the Treasurer shall draw up a statement indicating the buildings on which the taxes imposed have not been paid, in whole or in part. However, for several years, the Council of Métis-sur-Mer has been giving a two years grace period to pay municipal taxes. Now the Council wants the procedure to be standardized, that is, the taxes at 31st of December of the year before the current year must be paid. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact the municipal office.

HAZARDOUS MATERIAL DROP OFF

It is always possible to leave your hazardous materials at the municipal garage situated on Rue de l'Église.By hazardous materials we mean oil or any petroleum by-product such as "pitch", painting products, and domestic or automobile batteries.

You may simply leave these products in front of the door at the municipal garage.

The Green Newsletter - « Compostable bags are now accepted in the brown bin! »

GOOD NEWS for your brown bin! Compostable bags are now accepted in your organic wastes collection.

Many stores in the area already sell bags marked "COMPOSTABLE" and are in an already perfect format for the 7L kitchen brown bin delivered by your municipality. Here are some examples found locally of brands offering compostable bags: Glad, Hercules, Selection Eco, Bio-vert, Frank, Great Value, etc.

Look for the "COMPOSTABLE" label and logo on the box. Other names such as oxo-biodegradable, biodegradable are not accepted.

This measure is intended to respond the citizen requests to facilitate participation in the collection of organic materials, to counter odors and prevent the appearance of maggots and flies.

Note that the use of paper bags, newsprints and freezing your organic wastes are still good practices.

This dump is reserved strictly for the residents of Métis-sur-Mer.

The dump for branches, dead leaves and earth is located just across from 249, Chemin de la Station (fire station). Please follow the signs along the road to ensure you reach the designated area.

It is prohibited to dump garbage bags or construction wood.
