

# Community Monument Unveiled And Virtual Memorial Launched

While COVID rules limited to 25 people the attendance at this year's November 11 Remembrance Day ceremony, we hope many will visit the municipal offices to pay respects at the monument "The Torch/Le Flambeau" in the coming weeks. As well, the virtual memorial (heritagelsl.ca/commemoration-remembrance) was launched the same day. A work in progress (we've received a lot of material that we haven't yet had a chance to add yet), it provides a lot of photos, information, and stories about the region's contributions to war and peace

The ceremony, while small, remains an important part of the Metis and surrounding area's annual calendar. Metis Beach student Tommy Riley read John McCrae's "In Flanders Fields" and Anik Tardif read "Au champ d'honneur." Roger Tremblay, retired Canadian Navy Radio Communications Officer, and Marc-André Guilbault, representing the Legion and its members, laid a wreath at the base of the monument. It is a central granite stone with dedication plaque and deep-red poppy (now removed for the winter) between two memory walls of concrete sandbags representing the trenches of past wars. Roger, like many Armed Forces members, has filled his share of sandbags and says that the uneven, rough nature of the sandbags is an appropriate representation of the harshness and messiness of war and disaster.

Veterans, serving Armed Forces members, and first responders were thanked for their contributions. The British High Commission, in a letter, expressed immense gratitude to the people of Metis who tend and visit the graves of eight Commonwealth airmen who lost their lives in training accidents at the Mont-Joli WW2 bombing school. Jack Herbert, Nicole Fournier, and Roger Tremblay (representing the Legion) presented generous donations to help finance the project.





The Board and staff of Heritage Lower Saint Lawrence want to gratefully thank all of the people who have contributed in some way to the monument or virtual memorial to date, including the partners and sponsors

below. Donations of money and documents are still being gratefully accepted and will be used to complete the monument and memorial, expand access, and build knowledge of those connected to the area who have served and died in past conflicts.









# Info-prévention FOR HOLIDAYS WITHOUT BAD SURPRISES.



#### My beautiful (safe) tree.

Choose a tree whose needles are green and don't come off easily. Cut the trunk (at an angle) as soon as you get home: it will absorb water better. Place the tree in a container of water, and water it daily.

Whether natural or artificial, install your tree more than one meter away from any heat source (baseboard, heater, fireplace, etc.) and place it away from high traffic areas and exits.

#### At night: lights off.

Turn off light decorations as soon as you leave the house or go to bed. Your decorations and extension cords should be CSA or ULC certified. Choose low heat emitting bulbs (LED).

Throw away any light decorations that are defective, dried out or cracked and always respect the type of use for which they are designed, just like your extension cords (indoor or outdoor use).

Don't let extension cords run under carpets or in doorways, and never plug them end to end! Use a power bar to avoid overloading outlets and extension cords.

#### Inside and outside: clear the way.

In the event of a fire, being able to evacuate your home quickly is essential. Plan ahead for your family and guests by clearing snow from all your exits and balconies after each snowfall. Also make sure that nothing is in the way of the exit doors (boots, decorations, etc.). Windows must also be cleared of snow and thawed. A window blocked by ice can prevent escape.

Plan a meeting point accessible in winter and visible to the firefighters upon their arrival.

#### A candle: never unattended...

You want to add candles for a cozy ambiance? Make sure to place them on a stable surface and away from any material that could catch fire. At all times, keep them out of the reach of children and pets.

#### Never fill up a hot burner!

A good fondue during the holidays is heartwarming! The electric stove is preferred because it is safer. If you are using a stove with a burner, place it on a stable surface that can withstand heat. Provide a second burner, as you must avoid filling a hot burner.

#### Ethanol fireplace: a decoration to watch out for.

Ethanol fireplaces are increasingly popular. However, they are decorative and should not be used to heat a room.

Also, make sure that your residence is equipped with a carbon monoxide (CO) detector as well as an adequate portable fire extinguisher in good working order.

### The Green Newsletter - «Bring some good habits to the party!»



Hello,

With the pandemic, we don't yet know if we will be able to invite Santa over to our house for our Christmas time parties. So take advantage of this time with your family and in a smaller group to set up good habits that will last when we return to "normal". Here are some tips:

#### A green Christmas tree:

Prefer reusable decorations to single use. In addition, it will cost you less in the long run. For lights, use LED bulbs, which are more energy efficient and more durable.

Turn off your lights when you go to sleep or use a timer.

#### **Eco-gifts:**

Privilege gifts in the form of services, shared moments or gift cards to avoid the purchase of superfluous items. (eg, a massage session, a gift card from your bookstore, etc.) Otherwise, give preference to useful, sustainable and locally produced gifts, such as the work of a craftsman.

Pack your gifts as little as possible and use a wrapping paper made of recycled paper, but especially recyclable. Avoid shiny, metallic appliqués or non-recyclable plastics. Remember to have a blue bin nearby during the unpacking session!

#### Party time:

If possible, unpack in order to reuse the wrapping paper.

Use washable dishes. There shouldn't be more than a few plates to wash this year!

Manage your meals well by making sure that the leftovers will be consumed.

Remember, table waste goes into the brown bin, even in the holiday season. Don't forget, compostable plastic bags are accepted!
