




This month, we will talk about 2 contests in which we are participating.

Winter Duathlon



Metis has always been an attractive place for the young. Its vibrancy is mostly due to the children and adolescents who make Metis their own during the summer months....and come back as young adults and parents. What makes Metis so special?

After making the trip to Metis during the summer of 1898, this student returned to the University of Toronto and wrote up a detailed account in the university newspaper, *The Varsity*. The second oldest campus newspaper in the country, *The Varsity* has had many editors of note who have gone on to careers as journalists (Peter Gzowski), thinkers (Mark Kingwell) and political figures (William Lyon Mackenzie King, Bob Rae and Michael Ignatieff). This article is by the paper's editor in 1899, W.A.R. Kerr. Using the sophomoric language typical of university journalists, it offers a portrait of Metis from a different angle, sometimes laughing at the summer community, often caricaturing the French-Canadian population met during his stay and critiquing the sorry state of the handful of natives then selling their wares in the community.

LITTLE METIS: A LOWER ST. LAWRENCE WATERING-PLACE

Far away down on the South shore of the Lower St. Lawrence, two hundred miles below Quebec, and thirty miles East of Rimouski, where the cross-ocean liners take on and leave off their mails, lies one of the best, though not best-known, of Canadian summer resorts — Little Metis. As its strong, pure air is enjoyed mostly by Montrealers, and but comparatively few Toronto visitors are found there, I thought that perhaps a few words regarding the place and the people might be of some interest.




Little Metis Station was situated between the 3rd and 4th East Rang of Saint-Octave-de-Métis, on Route Petit Métis (Little Metis).

Little Metis is easy enough of access, for it is on the main line of the Intercolonial, though it is rather a long journey from Toronto — about seven hundred miles. If possible, it is better to arrive there during the day-time, for the drive of six miles down to the village, on the river bank, is one well worth having daylight for.

After the train pulls up, it will only be a matter of a few minutes till your baggage is loaded on a wagon and you are loaded on a buckboard. If you have a sluggish liver, a buckboard is an excellent stimulant

- especially the back seat. If you can get the front seat, drive; if not, take my advice and walk...

It is really, however, a beautiful run down. After a couple of miles we cross a height and begin to descend gradually towards the shore... After six miles of these ups and downs, we come to a turn in the way; the pace grows faster, the road better, and the smell of salt water stronger. Another minute and we dash past the post-office, a curious, octagonal, wooden building turn round it to the right, and draw up at the Cascade House, a big, blue-painted, shingle-covered, three-story structure, which is perched on the edge of a cliff fronting the sea or river — according to the name you give the St. Lawrence.




The Corner House in 1897, from Beach Road.

Little Metis is not exactly a metropolis, yet in summer it can boast of quite a large and aristocratic population. It has three large hotels and at least as many departmental stores. There is absolutely no known article of trade, from a hairpin to a haystack, from a flounder-spear to a jam-tart, that these cannot supply. In one respect at least they far surpass any of our large shops in Toronto, whose floors cover acres of space; notwithstanding the varied character of the stock carried by the Metis store, it is all packed into a room about twelve feet square. This wonderful business device saves the customer untold walking and fatigue. Instead of having to fight your way for half a mile from the boot counter to the confectionery stand, anyone can see the advantage of buying your overshoes and maple cream from the same saleswoman over the same counter.

Just as in Toronto and Montreal most of the retail shops are centred on Yonge and St. Catherine streets, similarly, or rather to an even greater degree, in Little Metis, hotels and shops, dwelling-houses and factories are all located on the one great thoroughfare. This renders it very easy to make your way about. If you are looking for somebody's house, all you have to do is to learn whether it is east or west, get started in the right direction, and you must in the end find it. You cannot possibly go wrong...

NOTICE TO ALL THE TAXPAYERS OF MÉTIS-SUR-MER SALE FOR NON-PAYMENT OF MUNICIPAL TAXES

As stipulated in the Cities and Towns Act, section VI, article 511, after the expiration of the six month period following the date of the notice of the deposit of the collection role, the Treasurer shall draw up a statement indicating the buildings on which the taxes imposed have not been paid, in whole or in part. However, for several vears, the Council of Métis-sur-Mer has been giving a two years grace period to pay municipal taxes. Now the Council wants the procedure to be standardized, that is, the taxes at 31st of December of the year before the current year must be paid. The Green Newsletter - « The brown bin : environmentally friendly? »

Is the transportation of our organic waste to Rivière-du-Loup really environmentally friendly? This is probably our most frequently asked question!

If you like simple answers, « yes it is ».

If you prefer more explanations, here's why:

Note that the calculation revolves around the idea that in order to be environmentally friendly, it must be *profitable* in terms of greenhouse gases. There are other ways to do it, but we need this text to stay short. Everything will be evaluated in "CO2 equivalent", meaning the potential of a greenhouse gas compared to CO2. This gas, being equivalent to itself, has a CO2 equivalent of 1. Methane has a CO2 equivalent of 25. It is therefore 25 times more potent than CO2 in terms of greenhouse gases.

Thus, let's take into account our CO2 equivalent expenses and gains from the following data:

- -Door-to-door collection by truck and trips to our Mont-Joli transhipment site multiplied by the number of collections for each municipality;
- -Round trips by truck from Mont-Joli to the biogas plant in Rivière-du-Loup;
- -In 2017, nearly 1,000 tons of organic waste avoided landfilling and therefore the creation of large quantities of methane.

After calculating with these parameters, our brown bin collection in 2017 enabled us to avoid the creation of 600 tonnes of "CO2 equivalent". It represents the amount of CO2 that 84,000 trees store in a year. This is the equivalent of having avoided making 4.2 million km by car, 10 times the Earth-Moon distance! That's why we encourage you to participate in the brown bin!

REGULATION NUMBER 18-120 CONCERNING THE REMUNERATION OF MUNICIPAL ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE TOWN OF MÉTIS-SUR-MER

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the taxpayers of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer by the undersigned, Stéphane Marcheterre, Director General and Secretary-Treasurer of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer,

That at the ordinary meeting held on March 12, 2018, regulation number 18-120 concerning the remuneration of municipal elected officials has been adopted;

That regulation number 18-120 provides that:

- The mayor's annual basic remuneration will be set at \$ 8 110. This remuneration is currently \$ 8 110;
- The annual basic remuneration of the other members of the Council will be set at \$ 2
 274. This remuneration is currently 2 274;
- In accordance with the Law, each member of the Council is entitled to an expense allowance in an amount equal to the half of the annual basic remuneration. The mayor's expense allowance will be \$ 4 055 and the other members of the Council' expense allowance will be \$1 137;
- In the event of the mayor's absence: if the replacement of the mayor by the substitute
 mayor reaches fifteen (15) days, the municipality pays an additional remuneration, from
 that time and until the replacement ceases, an amount equal to the remuneration of the
 mayor during that period. The application of this article does not affect the remuneration
 that the municipality pays to the mayor during his term of mayor.
- If the duration of such replacement is a specified period and exceeding thirty (30) days, the additional remuneration provided must be paid from the 1st day of replacement;
- The remuneration will be indexed upward for each financial year starting from the one that begins after the entry into force of the By-law;
- The remuneration proposed by this regulation will be retroactive to January 1, 2018;

That the regulation is available for consultation at the municipal Office.
