Let's keep our seal population happy

We are now into the birthing season for seal pups, which is also the season when seal pups die needlessly, either victims of the kindness of people who want to "help" them or the recklessness of those hoping for a cool selfie. True, they are adorable! And sure, their cries are heartbreaking and we want to rescue them. We do have good intentions! But the fact is that in general, they are simply resting or patiently waiting for their mother to return to feed them, which she won't do if there are two-legged creatures around! She might even abandon the pup if she no longer recognizes its scent because of human contact, condemning him to certain death.

Even after their weaning, it is not uncommon to see them staying for hours on the shore. They're still just resting. They are oblivious and may even come towards you, calling out to you. They don't know it's dangerous. You do! You want to help? Keep your distance (at least 50 m) and keep your dog on a leash! If you see people approaching a seal pup, explain that they are putting that baby's life in danger. If you have family or friends visiting, let them know too! Remember that these are unpredictable wild animals that can be aggressive, bite and transmit disease.

For kayakers, if you approach rock formations and the adult seals seem more and more agitated around you, they're telling you that you are too close and that you are disturbing them! They are likely protecting their pups. Just paddle away and they will probably escort you a while, giving you a great opportunity to observe them.

Call Marine Mammal Emergency immediately at 1-877-722-5346: if you see an injured seal; if people are handling or disturbing a seal on shore; or if you

find a dead seal beached ashore. If needed, trained volunteers can go on site to raise awareness. Unfortunately, Métis-sur-Mer is a known "hot spot" for cases of harassment involving seal pups, so let's spread



the word and try to educate not only the people here, but also the many visitors who come to see us every summer. The seals thank you!



AN ENGLISH OASIS

The highway around the Gaspé Peninsula was opened with great pomp in July, 1929. Politicians and priests gathered in nearly every village to celebrate the completion of Route 6, also known as Boulevard Perron. The new highway would bring an end to isolation and make the region a destination for driving holidays.

Travellers came to the region in ever-increasing numbers. The Gaspé tour also attracted journalists and writers. Many of them were American, but there were a handful of Canadians like Metisian Wilfred Bovey whose feature article on the Gaspé appeared in the *National Geographic* magazine in 1935.

Drifting Down the St. Lawrence was written by American teacher, writer and publisher Willis N. Bugbee. Appearing in 1939, it offers the most complete portrait of "An English Oasis" from this period:



"MÉTIS is an English settlement. To English-speaking people it is like an oasis in a desert, like the home-coming from a foreign land. Arrangements had been made for two of the pleasantest rooms at Metis Lodge, and on our arrival we met with a most cordial reception from Mr. and Mrs. Astle. We found the Lodge all that we could ask for — comfortable quarters, a delightful view overlooking the

river, excellent cuisine, and a friendliness on the part of both the hosts and the regular guests. A homey atmos-

phere pervaded. What more can human beings desire, except the freedom of their own home?

...In the river opposite the lodge and perhaps a half mile from shore is a large round rock commonly called "Pudding Rock," but which the early French had christened La Boule Rock. Later, when the English came, the name was at first mistaken for the world "bull" because of the similarity of pronunciation. Then what more natural than that the next larger one lying close by should be called the "cow," and that the still smaller ones should be known as the "calves"? And so they are often called

We pushed open the heavy door and went inside. Silence reigned over it all – an ominous silence. Every board in the floor creaked spookishly as we stepped on it. The wind blew dismally through the empty rooms. Part of the ceiling had fallen, and everything was in process of decay. And yet in these same rooms lives had been lived, and joys and sorrows had entered into those lives as they enter into ours to-day. But sh! Was that a ghost? – perhaps the spirit of one of the former occupants returning to its old haunts? Or was it a rat? It was a place where either one might be expected to roam at will.

Alas! as a man who has always led an honoured and upright life in his early years and sinks into disrepute in his old age, so did this old mansion have disgrace thrust upon it in its declining years. It is said to have been a rendez-vous for smugglers, who brought liquor here from St. Pierre by the bootleggers' express to the States.





...The great event of the week at Metis during the summer was the departure of the train for Montreal every Sunday evening. It was as if the natives and the summer residents had never seen a train before. The station

and platform were crowded as at a carnival.

During the days at Metis one fished or golfed or strolled along the beach or sat on the wide veranda and watched the steamers and freighters passing up and down. The river here is forty-five miles across. As for ourselves, we speculated as to what might be on the opposite shore and made our plans for an exploration of that unknown land.

We still have pleasant recollections of the days spent at Métis, of the genial landlord of the Lodge and his realistic stories, of the hospitality of himself and his good wife, of the sociability and comradeship of the guests who were there at the time, mostly Canadians; of the huge bonfire that was built on a Saturday night on the beach, and of the delicious marshmallows toasted by the young people over

the glowing embers on the end of long saplings; of the merry Canadian folk songs which we sang around the flickering firelight that at length faded away in the darkness of the night, leaving only the moon and the stars to shed their mellow light upon us."





NOTICE TO ALL THE TAXPAYERS OF MÉTIS-SUR-MER SALE FOR NON-PAYMENT OF MUNICIPAL TAXES

As stipulated in the Cities and Towns Act, section VI, article 511, after the expiration of the six month period following the date of the notice of the deposit of the collection role, the Treasurer shall draw up a statement indicating the buildings on which the taxes imposed have not been paid, in whole or in part. However, for several years, the Council of Métis-sur-Mer has been giving a two years grace period to pay municipal taxes. Now the Council wants the procedure to be standardized, that is, the taxes at 31st of December of the year before the current year must be paid. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact the municipal office.

HAZARDOUS MATERIAL DROP OFF

Summer is an occasion to gather all your family and friends for a nice BBQ. Having washable tableware for everyone can be difficult to manage, but you still want to be eco-responsible and avoid any waste! So you turn to the compostable tableware so you can put everything in your brown bin.

But BEWARE! It's not because a product has the mention "compostable" that it really is. In fact, to be certain that it is compostable and therefore accepted in the brown bin, a recognized standard organisation must certify the product. Here are the only 3 certification standards and logos for compostable products:

Quebec/Canada standard BNQ 0017-088



American standard

ASTM 6400



European standard

EN 13432



Without any of these logos, even if it's written "compostable", "biodegradable" or if there is another similar logo on your product, take for granted that it will not be accepted in the brown bin collection, to avoid contamination.
