

There is another novelty this year: a snowshoe trail. It can be accessed via the entrance B on route Dion. The trail goes through the woods and brings you to the chalet. We are looking at lengthening the trail.

St-Valentine's Day Gift Baskets





Introduction

By the 1870s, Metis was becoming a well-known watering hole. It was also beginning to be noticed in the newspapers far and wide. With regular trains running on the Intercolonial Railway from 1876 and regular steamship service, Metis was suddenly easily accessible. Trains brought passengers. Passengers brought notice. Notice brought tourists. Tourists led journalists to write about this seaside community. This article, signed "H.H.Y.", first appeared in the Quebec Morning Chronicle on October 2, 1878 and in French several days later in Le Journal de Québec on October 11, 1878:

A FAVOURITE WATERING PLACE A REALLY RURAL RETREAT

...The tourist who...leaves Quebec on a Tuesday at 2 p.m. will be landed at Metis the following day at 9 a.m. by disembarking per a substantial sail boat (steered by Mr. Ferguson, the agent of the Company) which puts out from Ferguson's point to meet the steamer. On stepping on to the rocky shore vehicles in abundance are found ready to take the traveller anywhere or everywhere. Prominent objects from the beach are the Ferguson Manor and the new hotel. Visitors

have their choice between Grant's Hotel, recently built at the Point and now open, and the two spacious hostelries on the bay of Metis, two miles distant, vis: -Astle's Hotel and Turriff's new house, just finished. The latter is two storys high, one hundred feet long and forty in depth; situate on the very brink of the St. Lawrence, sixty or eighty feet above high water mark. A sandy beach stretches out in front which for bathers is probably the best in Little Metis. Mine host at Grant's Hotel is well-known to tourists, as he formerly kept a hostelry at Rimouski.

...Little Metis is...quite the sea-bathing retreat of Montrealers, many of whom have acquired sites on the bay and erected thereon roomy dwellings or tiny cottages, *ornes*, amidst meadows or picturesque woodland. The eastern portion of the new Metis settlement is called the McGill College-End. Conspicuous among many other structures are the handsome residences of Professor Dawson, Messrs Murray, McNicholl, Dr. Trenholme, Mrs. Redpath, Mrs. Major, Messrs. Lyman, Stephens, & c., all fringing the crescent-shaped cove of Little Metis.

The courteous and obliging seigneur of Metis, Mr. Ferguson, has recently erected some very eligible cottages and, in fact, is yet building more, which are let at very reasonable figures. Many of these have been purchased outright. There are many lots for sale on which the purchaser can erect his houses and place therein his Penates at his own pleasure. For admirable position, healthfulness, scenery, rest and pleasure, there appears to be no better locality than Little Metis.

...Gaelic is spoken freely in the settlement. But few French Canadians live there, and intermarriage with the Scotch is but of very rare occurrence. The lands of the latter are but little mortgaged, showing a favorable distinction from their French neighbors. Some of the original immigrants have sold out in Metis and started

farming in Greenbush, Wisconsin, but, it is believed, with not such good fortune as in the Province of Quebec....

For Little Metis, as a sea shore retreat during the heat of summer, a bright future is in store. Land is cheap, lodging extremely moderate, the climate salubrious; there are daily rail and mail communications with the rest of the world and telegraphy at a moment's requisition....
