

The Canadian Magazine published Little Métis & Thereabouts by journalist Frank Yeigh in 1917. Yeigh stayed with a local "habitant" family and admired their hard work and large families. His interest in the point of view of the farmers in Sandy Bay provides a useful perspective of how farm families were adjusting to the new world.



#### LITTLE MÉTIS & THEREABOUTS

Away down on the St. Lawrence where the kingly river is forty miles wide, is a little English speaking island in a French-Canadian sea, one of the many settlements where a group of Protestant English settlers have held their own during the long years though ringed around with neighbours of another tongue and religion...



In 1909, the second lighthouse is under contruction. The first one was constructed in wood in 1874.

The Little Métis today is a summer suburb of Montreal, where many magnates of our commercial metropolis have palatial homes, with the usual modern accompaniments of steam yachts and limousines. Where not so long ago the buckboard planquettes of the habitant had the narrow winding roads to themselves, now the big blazing eyes of a honking monster cast their shafts of light around the sharp corners where danger signs hang, running opposition to the triple flashing

beacons from the stately lighthouse...

There is a point where the line is crossed between Sandy Bay between the seignory of Scots possession and a parish of French Canada. The changes are quickly evident in architecture, in the prevalent speech and signs, in the increased size of the families as indicated by the swarms

of kiddies who line the highway, which is one of their playgrounds through the vested rights of generations of free use. A hundred-thousand dollar church, whose spire is seen miles away, rears its massive stone walls in the heart of the straggling village of a single street, as the curé watches the great structure grow....




And what a friendly note in the landscape is struck by the open air bake-ovens. A most ancient dame has steam up in the one we just passed, catching on the wing that most pleasant of all odours; baking and browning bread. Clothes lines, too, afforded an open air art gallery of handicrafts. Rugs and quilts, as wonderful in design as in brilliant colours, exhibit the cleverness of Mrs. Habitant at her hard loom...

Other wayside glimpses into the little frame houses that border the Quebec highway linger in the memory. Because it is



a summer day, doors and windows are open to sun and air, revealing the quaint interiors to the inquisitive. Many a contrast is seen. At a window sits a woman, spinning in the good old-fashioned way of our pioneer grandmothers, from the wool shorn from their own sheep. The contrast comes in an up-to-date sewing machine ready at hand. A habitant farmer just passed by, clad in the queerest suit of homespun imaginable. It was literally a garment new and old, the latest patches showing with startling clearness in between the faded checker-board sections of the suit.



Cross by the roadside.

Down the turnpike ambles a yoke of oxen, drawing a generous load of hay. Once they would have had the turnpike to themselves, but now an assertive automobile challenges a right-of-way with insolent honkings. A young swell from the next parish advertises the fact that he has a vacant seat in his glossy top-buggy, and that he is on his happy way to pick her up, as he speeds around the curving twists of the road another contrast is had in a big shaggy dog hauling a diminutive two-wheeled cart and a large-sized man — a bit of Belgian or Dutch transportation in Canada.

It is a land of the home-made...In the white-washed home just across the way chairs and tables were of manifestly home manufacture. Children's swings abound. The baby carriage was a soap box on wheels, with a canopy of loud chintz shielding child number twenty-four from the mid-day sun. For they still grow large families in Quebec. Up in the twenties are not infrequent, while one of my pension landladies, having no offspring of her own, has already adopted eight girls in succession!

But the last vacation day finally comes. Madame serves her last meal to the strangers within her gates and doors; "her man" (much smaller in stature than she) drives us to the station, good-bye is said to the big river and the little rivers that feed it, to the long narrow farms and the white-walled homes, and the kind-hearted rustic people who live therein.

#### A WORD FROM YOUR MAYOR

The months just fly by in an active community like Métis-sur-Mer. I attended the Défi OSEntreprendre Gala in Mont-Joli where both École



l'Evol and Metis Beach School received awards for their entrepreneurship projects. I would like to congratulate both the teachers and the students for their energy and hard work in attaining this level of achievement.

I would also like to congratulate

Philippe Cavanah and his class of 2016-2017 who received a \$ 5,500 grant for their project and did a presentation worthy of mention at the general meeting of the Caisse Désjardins of Mont-Joli. We are very fortunate to have such a high quality of committed teachers guiding our children.

You have probably read in the L'Avantage newspaper about the progress of the Lighthouse file and the work planned on the retaining wall in front of the municipal office. We are working very hard to ensure that the wall will be completed before the tourist season begins.

I attended a citizen meeting on the serious issue of health services cutbacks. Currently there is a petition circulating in our public places, and on Facebook: Redevelopment of the Hospital Center of Mitis. It is important for all of us to mobilize to ensure we stop the closure of health services in Mont-Joli. We are a population of 19029 permanent residents in the Mitis MRC, plus approximately 4000 summer residents, which results in 8.2 inhabitants per square kilometre. If we compare that to the MRC of the Matanie, the latest statistics show their populations at 22 000 inhabitants or 6.6 inhabitants per square kilometre. At the Matane Hospital there is a 24 hour emergency service amongst other services that we do not have. We are currently in a health care crisis and we have to deal with it now to ensure we prevent further loss of our services

The next meeting of the MacNider Bourough Council will take place on May 7 at 6:30 pm and the Métis-sur-Mer council meeting will follow at 7:30 pm; both to be held at the Métis-sur-Mer Municipal Office.

# NOTICE TO ALL THE TAXPAYERS OF MÉTIS-SUR-MER SALE FOR NON-PAYMENT OF MUNICIPAL TAXES

As stipulated in the Cities and Towns Act, section VI, article 511, after the expiration of the six month period following the date of the notice of the deposit of the collection role, the Treasurer shall draw up a statement indicating the buildings on which the taxes imposed have not been paid, in whole or in part. However, for several years, the Council of Métis-sur-Mer has been giving a two years grace period to pay municipal taxes. Now the Council wants the procedure to be standardized, that is, the taxes at 31st of December of the year before the current year must be paid. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact the municipal office.

#### HAZARDOUS MATERIAL DROP OFF

It is always possible to leave your hazardous materials at the municipal garage situated on Rue de l'Église.By hazardous materials we mean oil or any petroleum by-product such as "pitch", painting products, and domestic or automobile batteries.

You may simply leave these products in front of the door at the municipal garage.

PLEASE, do not leave products other than those mentioned above.
